



Know The Signs of a Natural Gas Leak



Natural gas is actually odorless and colorless.

We add an unpleasant odorant so you can smell it. Natural gas is one of the cleanest and safest energy sources available, but leaks can occur in rare instances.

Signs of an indoor gas leak:

- an odor that smells like rotten eggs
- unusual noises coming from your gas equipment

Signs of an outdoor gas leak:

- dirt or debris being blown into the air
- persistent bubbles from wet areas on the ground
- vegetation over or near a pipeline appears discolored or dead

If you smell natural gas or notice any of these signs, leave the area immediately.

DO NOT attempt to find the leak yourself.

DO NOT turn on or off any electrical switches.

DO NOT use the telephone in your home.
